# **Vasectomy Discharge Instructions**

#### **General Instructions**

• It is normal to have some swelling above the testicle and tenderness of one or both testicles. This may take several weeks to decrease.

• Some men will develop a sperm granuloma or pea-sized nodule above the testicle where the vasectomy was performed. This is normal and does not require any attention.

## Wound Care

- No stitches were used to close the skin
- · Some mild drainage is normal for up to 72 hours
- Mild bruising is normal
- Wear compression shorts, jock strap or tight boxer briefs for at least 1 week

Ice Packs - we suggest bags of frozen peas (at least 4) they conform nicely to the scrotum. 20 minutes on 3-4 times a day for the first 72hrs.

#### Medications

- · You may take Tylenol or Ibuprofen over the counter as directed
- You will be sent home on: Tramadol 50 mg every 6 hours as needed for

uncontrolled pain

## Activity

• You can go back to most of your normal activities including walking, using stairs.

You may shower tomorrow

## For at least the first 72 hours after your vasectomy

o No heavy lifting (more than 10 lbs or 5 kilograms).

- o No strenuous exercises.
- o No sexual activity for 1-2 weeks after procedure

## Follow-up

You will need to do a Post Vasectomy Seman Analysis (PVSA)

In 2-3 months and at least 20 ejaculations. You can purchase the kit from us or log into **meetfellow.com** and purchase one from them.

• The result of your PVSA will be emailed directly to you, so, YOU MUST USE OTHER FORMS OF CONTRACEPTION OR RISK PREGNANCY.

# When to Call the Nurse (615-527-4700 option 3)

• If you develop any of the following please call the nurse immediately:

- o Fever > 101 degrees.
- o Excessive swelling or bleeding from the scrotum
- o Nausea/vomiting or pain that is not improving with the pain medication

• You may also message us via the Advanced MD Patient Portal for **non-urgent** Questions. Remember it takes up to 8-10 weeks to fully heal.
